How Does God View Money?

Read: 2 Corinthians 9:6-15

Main idea: The grace of God is what motivates Christians to live a generous lifestyle which ultimately produces thanksgiving and the worship of God.

Key Verses: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (9:7 ESV)

Key Principles:

- The sacrifice of Jesus should radically change our perspective on generosity and giving.
- Reluctant or guilt-driven gifts are not a sign of generosity at all.
- A generous lifestyle produces a life of freedom, simplicity, joy, fruitfulness and purpose.
- Christian generosity can seem risky, but our security is in the knowledge that God provides all things and holds onto us no matter the circumstances.
- True, grace-driven, cheerful giving is fulfilling and contagious.
- God does not "pay us back" when we give, rather the most important "gain" from generosity is a closer walk with Jesus Christ and a greater union of your life with His.

Discussion:

- 1. What words and illustrations are used to describe the attitude about giving that God will honor? In what ways will He honor it?
- 2. What does this passage list as the outcomes or fruit of Christian generosity? In what ways do we misunderstand these outcomes? Why?
- 3. What does this passage tell us is God's purpose in providing the giver everything he or she needs to be generous?
- 4. Do you believe that giving is a tangible expression of your trust in God? Why or why not?
- 5. What giving experience has taught you the most about God? Do you see money as a tool for God or a tool for you?
- 6. Besides your financial resources, what other gifts should we use for God's glory? How do we see others using these gifts in our church? Community? Around the world?

Prayer:

- Reflect on the generous gift of Jesus Christ taking your place under God's wrath.
- Prav:
 - o That God would help you to respond generously to His great gift of salvation.
 - o That generosity would be a blessing to experience and not a burden to bare.
 - o That your greatest desire would be to build His kingdom and not your own.
