The Tenth Commandment

Read: Exodus 20:17

Main idea: God's commands for us to love Him and others culminate in a response to His sovereignty with worship, trust and contentment in His provisions for us.

Key Verses: "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's." **(20:17 ESV)**

Key Principles:

- Coveting is the act of setting your desires on something or someone in a way that you devise a plan to accomplish the fulfillment of that desire if the opportunity arises.
- Our desires should be to worship, love and trust God above everything that this world offers.
- When we covet something it causes us to make really bad decisions to obtain it, but even when we get it we are never satisfied.
- The only thing that truly satisfies us is to find contentment in loving, worshiping and serving the God who made us for His glory.
- If we choose to chase after the things of this world, then eventually we realize that we can never be satisfied and we become bitter and cynical.
- Jesus gives us the secret to contentment in Matthew 10:39.

Discussion:

- 1. Have you ever desired something so much that you made yourself sick? Maybe sick with worry that you will never obtain it? Why was it so important?
- 2. What happens if you seek after and obtain everything that you covet in this world? How will affect your life? What about your eternity?
- 3. What happens if you never obtain any of the things you covet in this world? Can you still have abundant life? How will it affect your eternity?
- 4. How does focusing on loving God and loving others help us to find contentment in Christ? How does that affect our Christian witness?
- 5. Take a moment to reread the ten commandments. What is the purpose of the law? Why is it important for us to remember that we are sinners?
- 6. Read Exodus 20:18-21. Why did Israel respond this way after God gave them the law? What does that tell us about how we should respond?

Prayer:

- Pray that we would remember to love God and love others the way God desires.
- Pray:
 - That we would find our contentment in loving, worshiping and trusting God.
 - That we would see people and possessions as blessings not achievements.
 - That we would remember that Christ stands between us and the wrath of God.
