## The Spirit of Christmas Past

#### Read: Matthew 1:18-25

**Main idea:** Jesus Christ is fully God and fully human and He came to save His people from their sins.

**Key Verses:** "She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet: "Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall call his name Immanuel" (which means, God with us)." **(1:21-22 ESV)** 

#### **Key Principles:**

- Jesus was born to a virgin mother and an adoptive father by the power of the Holy Spirit just as the Bible describes.
- This type of birth was the only way that Jesus could be born fully human and fully divine.
- If Jesus were not both God and man, then He could never have accomplished the purpose for which He was born, to "save His people from their sins."
- Trusting in Jesus requires the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives just as it did Mary and Joseph.
- Our Heavenly Father is a faithful God that always keeps His promises to His people.
- The only proper response to the faithfulness of God is to believe, obey and surrender to His will for our lives.

#### **Discussion:**

- 1. How would the denial of the virgin birth of Jesus affect the gospel message? Why is essential that Jesus was born this way?
- 2. Can you explain how Jesus' divine and human natures are different, yet unified?
- 3. What was the role of the Holy Spirit in the birth of Jesus? Why do you think this was an important part of the Christmas story?
- 4. How does the birth of Jesus fulfill the promise of Genesis 3:15? What about Isaiah 7:14?
- 5. How should Matthew 1:21 shape the way you read the rest of this Gospel? Using this verse, how would you explain to an unbeliever that Jesus is both God and man?
- 6. When you think about the Christmas story, what is the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives as we read and celebrate the birth of Jesus?

### Prayer:

• Thank God for His faithfulness in fulfilling His promise of salvation through Jesus.

• Pray:

- That we grow in our trust and obedience to God's plan and purpose for our lives.
- That would reflect Christ's presence as we follow Him.
- For opportunities to share the message of Jesus, bring hope to others.
