Pastor Spotlight FEATURING ANDRÉS CAÑOLA, SPANISH WORSHIP PASTOR



Born in Colombia, Pastor Andrés Cañola came to the United States in 1999 with a goal to work in the music production field with his talent of singing and playing guitar. He studied at ASSI University in Colombia, majoring in marketing and We invite you to join us Sunday advertising. He was a studio recording engineer, doing musical commercials and music production.

He began his walk with the Lord in the year 2000 and in 2002 began serving in the praise team at a church in Pembroke Pines. In 2007, he fell in love with a beautiful and talented lady named Luisa, who was part of a dance ministry in West Palm Beach. During this time, he also began working as a worship leader. He was hired under the assumption that his residence papers were being handled by a lawyer; but after some years, he learned that the lawyer had defrauded him. He learned this when the authorities arrested him with intent to deport.

He was incarcerated for three months, but throughout the ordeal of It 's $for\ Kids!$... $and\ Adults$ being in prison, he witnessed and ministered to fellow prisoners. By divine intervention he was released and directed to an immigration lawyer to assist him in obtaining citizenship. What a testimony he has!

Andres and Luisa were supposed to be married in early October of 2007, but he was arrested during that time. He was released from prison October 31, 2007 and the following Saturday Andres and Luisa were married. Wanting to raise their family in a spacious environment to homeschool their children, they located a home in Dunnellon. He began working as worship leader in the Spanish services with Pastor Rogney in 2022 and was then named Prayer Leader in 2023.

Pastor Andres and his wife, Luisa, have a beautiful family with eight children: Thomas, Miranda, Victoria, Sofia, Rebecca, Simon, Mateo, and Julia.

As overseer of the prayer ministry he and volunteers meet in the Conference Room on Sundays at 9:15, Wednesdays at 10:00 for English and Thursdays at 10:00 for Spanish and is available on Wednesday evening for the Prayer Service at 6:00 pm in the main auditorium. He welcomes all volunteers in this very needed ministry.

DID YOU KNOW?

Frances Jane van Alstyne (March 24, 1820 - February 12, 1915) was more commonly known as Fanny Crosby. She was a mission worker, poet, lyricist and composer. Blinded at 6 weeks old, she grew up to be a teacher and worked with rescue missions as well as being an avid advocate for educating other blind people. Known as "Queen of Gospel Song Writers," she wrote more than 8,000 hymns and gospel songs with 100 million copies printed, including Praise Him! Praise Him! and Blessed Assurance.
